Those who love Rock and roll and appreciate masterpiece guitars have a chance to own a piece of history. The guitars were purchased brand new and have rarely been played.

Part of the extraordinary collection include:

- The Steve Miller signature edition - a Martin 00-37K2 SM which is the first run of Martin made guitars and is no longer produced. Of the 68 made, Auction Inn possess #32 that originally retailed for \$6250.
- Another work of art is the Gibson Peter Frampton Les Paul Special Electric Guitar.
- Also included is an American made fender telecaster. American fenders are the top of the line

Among the artists who signed the guitars were: Peter Frampton, Steve Miller, Les Paul, Pete Townsend, Steve Howe, Jimmie Page and Kenny Loggins.

The anonymous seller decided to put the guitars on e-Bay to help capitalize on the increased attention and interest of this rare collection. Millions of people across the world view e-Bay each day.
